This term our topic will be Around the World With a focus on Edmund Hilary and Amy Johnson. We will cover many areas of the curriculum throughout this. Please see below an overview of what we will be studying over the next 12 weeks.

Maths We will be focusing on Multiplication and Division in Spring 1. In spring 2, we will be focusing on fractions, length, height, weight and volume.		Design and Technology We will be developing the children’s understanding of Structures and Mechanisms where they will have to design and explain their ideas; choose appropriate resources and tools explaining their choice as well as evaluating their final product.	
Geography The children will be learning to understand geographical similarities and differences through studying the human and physical geography of a small area of the United Kingdom, and of a small area in a contrasting non-European country		Science We will be studying the topic of living things and their habitats during the Spring term.	Reading Children will develop their reading skills reading a range of texts and furthering their understanding with a variety of follow up activities.
Music We will be studying Musical Me in Spring 1 and British songs and sounds in Spring 2.	Computing We will be learning about the importance of staying safe online through e-safety.	PE P.E. for Spring 1 will be Hull FC on a Thursday which will have a club available. P.E for Spring 2 will be Hull FC Dance on a Tuesday which will not have a club available.	
RE In Spring 1, we will be learning the topic ‘lead us not into temptation’. In Spring 2 we will study the topic ‘Why Does Easter Matter to Christians?’.		History We will learn about significant pioneers with a particular focus on Edmund Hillary and Amy Johnson including who they were; their significant achievements and comparing these tour own school vision and values.	
Writing We will be studying a range of stories including Be More Bernard by Simon Philip; Grandad’s Island by Benji Davies; and The Koala Who Could by Rachel Bright across the Spring term. Your child will develop their writing skills including: Planning, drafting, evaluating, editing and proof-reading their writing and applying vocabulary, grammar and punctuation through the forms of character descriptions, posters, original writing, diary entry and more.
