Autumn Term 2022

Welcome back! I hope you have all had a lovely summer.

This term our topic will be World War Two and we will cover many areas of the curriculum throughout this. Please see below an overview of what we will be studying over the next 14 weeks.

Science The children will be studying animals including humans for the first half term and living things and their habitats in the second half term.	Art and Design The children will be learning about landscape painting. The children will seek inspiration from John Constable and his famous 'Study of Poppies'	Computing The children will be learning about data handling.
Design and Technology The children will be developing their sewing skills and creating their own Christmas decorations inspired by Coco Chanel.	Geography The children will be studying 'place' and comparing Britain to the country of Germany, identifying similarities and difference between the two.	History The children will be learning about the outbreak of World War Two and how it impacted Britain. They will also study key influential figures such as Winston Churchill.
French The children will be focussing on core vocabulary to describe portraits and will move on to study vocabulary relating to clothing.	Music The children will be listening to and performing body and tuned percussion as well as listening to music of the rock and roll genre.	PE PE will be on a Thursday with Hull FC practising team games until half term, then a Tuesday with Hull FC doing gymnastics until Christmas. Weather permitting, it will be outdoor PE.
RE Children will explore, find out more about their local community and locality as well as explore what is means to belong.	Maths Children will be learning place value and developing their understanding of the value of digits, ordering and comparing numbers as well as understanding how to round them. Children will also develop their understanding of the 4 operations including +/-/x/÷	
Writing The children will be studying The Lion, The Witch and The Wardrobe. Children will have the opportunity to write in a range of given forms including: diary entries, letters, non- chronological reports, character descriptions and stories (myths).		Reading Children will develop their reading skills reading a range of texts and answering inference questions to better understand what they have read.
