### Curriculum Newsletter

Welcome back, I hope everybody had a wonderful Easter.

This term our topic will be Everywhere Around Me with a focus on our local community. We will cover many areas of the curriculum throughout this. Please see below an overview of what we will be studying over the Summer term.

<b>Maths</b>  We will be focusing fractions and time in Summer 1. In Summer 2, we will be revisiting the four operations + - x ÷ with a focus on problem solving as well as statistics and geometry.		<b>Design and Technology</b>  We will be developing the children’s understanding of Food Technology where they will have to design and explain their ideas; choose appropriate ingredients and equipment explaining their choice as well as evaluating their final product.	
<b>Geography</b>  The children will be learning to develop their skills and fieldwork by using a range of maps, atlases, globes and photos to compare and contrast features of the local community as well as undertaking simple fieldwork within school locality.		<b>Science</b>  We will be studying the topic of plants and seasonal change during the Summer term.	<b>Reading</b>  Children will develop their reading skills reading a range of texts and furthering their understanding with a variety of follow up activities.
<b>Music</b>  We will be studying Dynamics, timbre, tempo and motifs in Summer 1 and Myths and Legends in Summer 2.	<b>Computing</b>  We will be learning about using multimedia to create a project	<b>PE</b>  P.E. for Summer 1 will be First Step Sports on a Wednesday which will have a club available. P.E for Summer 2 will be Hull FC on a Thursday which will have a club available.	
<b>RE</b>  In Summer 1, we will be learning the topic ‘believing’. In Summer 2 we will study the topic ‘Questions – What are the big questions?’.	<b>Art and Design</b>  Develop a wide range of art and design techniques in using colour, pattern, texture, line, shape, form and space with a study of Jackson Pollock.	<b>History</b>  We will learn about the significance of our local area with a particular focus on Skidby Windmill including the history as well as the significance to the community and comparing these to our own school vision and values.	
<b>Writing</b>  We will be studying a range of stories including The Secret Sky Garden by Linda Sarah & Fiona Lumbers; Tad by Benji Davies; and Dogs Don’t Do Ballet by Anna Kemp across the Summer term. Your child will develop their writing skills including: Planning, drafting, evaluating, editing and proof-reading their writing and applying vocabulary, grammar and punctuation through the forms of recounts, instructional writing, persuasion and many more.
