This term our topic will be 'local study' with a focus on St Michael's church. We will cover many areas of the curriculum throughout this. Please see below an overview of what we will be studying over the next 13 weeks.

<p>Science The children will be studying plants and the process of pollination and fertilisation.</p>	<p>Art and Design The children will be learning about the artist Banksy and exploring street art through a contemporary lens.</p>	<p>Computing The children will be learning about multimedia.</p>
<p>Design and Technology The children will be developing their understanding of food technology which will include seasonality and food hygiene.</p>	<p>Geography The children will be studying skills and fieldwork, with a focus on the local area.</p>	<p>History The children will be learning about the building of St Michael's church and it's uses from past to present day.</p>
<p>French The children will be focussing on vocabulary linked to food, weather and the water cycle.</p>	<p>Music The children will be listening to samba and carnival sounds, before moving on to adapting and transferring motifs.</p>	<p>PE PE will be on a Tuesday with Hull FC practising dance until half term, then a Wednesday with First Steps practising archery.</p>
<p>RE Children will explore 'Our World' and find out more about creation stories from across different religions, as non-religious views.</p>	<p>Maths Children will be studying money and statistics, before moving on to explore time, shape and mass. As always, basic skills and times tables will be taught alongside this and so any extra work at home on these is extremely helpful. If you need support accessing Times Table Rock Stars, please ask.</p>	
<p>Writing The children will be studying The Proudest Blue by Ibtihaj Muhammad until half term and then The Eye of the Wolf by Daniel Pennac. Children will have the opportunity to write in a range of given forms including: narratives, persuasive texts and balanced arguments. They will also explore other non-fiction texts throughout, mixed with poetry.</p>		<p>Reading Children will develop their reading skills through our main book and also accompanying texts which will include non-fiction and poetry.</p>
