This term our topic will be Rome with a focus on Julius Caesar. We will cover many areas of the curriculum throughout this. Please see below an overview of what we will be studying over the coming weeks.

Science The children will be studying states of matter for the first half term and forces and magnets in the second half term.	Art and Design The children will be learning about the architect Libon from Ancient Greek times and developing their technical drawing skills.		Computing The children will be learning about e-safety.
Geography The children will be studying human and physical features of geography.			History will be learning about the rule of esar and life in Ancient Rome.
French The children will be focussing on core vocabulary to describe French playground games and items in a French classroom.	Music The children will be creating compositions in response to animations and listening to pentatonic melodies and composition.		PE PE will be on a Wednesday with First Steps practising fencing until half term, then a Thursday with Hull FC doing athletics until Easter. Weather permitting, it will be outdoor PE.
RE Children will explore founders of faith and why Christians call the day Jesus died 'Good Friday'.	Maths Year 3 will study multiplication and division, length and perimeter, fractions and mass and capacity. Year 4 will study multiplication and division, length and perimeter, fractions and decimals.		
Writing The children will be studying Julius Zebra by Gary Northfield. Children will have the opportunity to write in a range of given forms including: diary entries, character descriptions and play scripts. They will also explore narrative writing in more detail and build up their skills to write their own 5-part narrative.			Reading Children will develop their reading skills through our main book and also accompanying texts which will include non- fiction and poetry.
