Autumn Term 2023

Welcome back to everyone. This term our topic will be 'Best of Britain' and we will cover many areas of the curriculum throughout this. Please see below an overview of what we will be studying during this time.

Science The children will be studying animals including humans for the first half term with a focus on the circulatory system. Then living things and their habitats.	Art and Design The children will be learning about August Rodin and taking inspiration from his work to design and make their own sculptures using clay.	Computing The children will be learning about different technology in their lives and how they can use them.
Design and Technology The children will be developing their sewing skills to create a Christmas decoration inspired by Stella McCartney.	Geography The children learn about key aspects of human geography including types of settlement and land use.	History The children will learn about the Vikings with a focus on Erik the Red.
MFL The children will be learning vocabulary linked to monster pets and space.	Music The children will be learning about looping, remixing and musical theatre.	PSHE The children will be learning about families and relationships as well as health and wellbeing.
RE Children will explore the question 'Was Jesus the Messiah?' and how we express our beliefs.	Maths Y5 Place value, four operations and fractions. Y6 Place value, four operations, fractions and converting units.	PE This term the children will be learning about fencing and team games.
Writing The children will be learning about genres of writing that informs and entertains people. They will learn how to write using criteria such as expanded noun phrases and relative clauses. They will then have the opportunity to complete extended writing including reports, recounts, diaries, biographies and letters.		Reading The children will be studying the book Viking Boy, by Tony Bradman, alongside a range of other texts. They will focus on areas including vocabulary, prediction and retrieval this term.
