

## Class 4 Curriculum Newsletter

### Autumn Term 2021



Welcome back to everyone.

This term our topic will be 'Heroes and Heroines' and we will cover many areas of the curriculum throughout this. Please see below an overview of what we will be studying during this time.

<b>Science</b> The children will be studying animals including humans for the first half term with a focus on the circulatory system.	<b>Art and Design</b> The children will be learning about drawing using pencils- they will be studying the work of Paul Cadden, Jonny Shaw and Dirk Dzimersky.	<b>Computing</b> The children will be learning about programming with a focus on variables.
<b>Design and Technology</b> The children will be developing their sewing skills to create a Christmas decoration	<b>Geography</b> The children will be learning about maps, how to locate significant countries/cities they are studying and how to plan a route.	<b>History</b> The children will learn about heroes and heroines both past and present with a focus on the fishing industry in Hull and the tragedies that occurred.
<b>MFL</b> The children will be focussing on recapping/learning the basic French vocabulary including greetings, numbers and animals in order to take part in simple conversations.	<b>Music</b> The children will be learning about features of a piece of music. They will then use this knowledge to appraise music from different eras.	<b>PE</b> PE will be on a Monday and Tuesday with a focus on dance and yoga. <b>Please ensure they have full PE kit with them</b>
<b>RE</b> Children will explore religious leaders, considering what attributes they have and why they are so important to their religious followers.	<b>Maths</b> Children will be learning place value and developing their understanding of the value of digits, ordering and comparing numbers as well as understanding how to round them. Children will also develop their understanding of the 4 operations including $+$ / $-$ / $\times$ / $\div$	
<b>Writing</b> The children will be studying Survivors by David Long. Children will learn about writing to inform and have the opportunity to write in a range of given forms including: diary entries, recounts, newspapers and information text.		<b>Reading</b> They will develop their reading skills studying Survivors. We will focus on areas including vocabulary, prediction and retrieval
